

# Phuket April 2019






up early, taxi waiting ...

some nice views of the Andaman Islands on the trip over here is Phi Phi, looks very inviting, all those beaches are supposed to have beautiful coral - next trup





- coming into the Phuket airport, over the getting-famous beach ...



for orientation - I'm staying in the southwest, place called Kata Beach, at the Two Chefs inn
















nice view, nice room - at 1300 baht/night!!






first snorkel -Kata south cape short intro - just for context - below is a pic I grabbed off the net to not have to go looking through hundreds of my own pics from years in the past - this is what a 'healthy' reef looks like, overall - many varieties of coral, colorful, obviously healthy, lots of fish of many species and colors and sizes swimming around - I went to 3 places that were advertised as 'some of the best snorkeling in Phuket', and found nothing even remotely approaching what we might call a healthy and vibrant reef' - just bits of coral growing on rock here and there and a few mostly not very interesting fish swimming around ...



first snorkel - Kata south cape - color is a bit greenish, partly the camera, but mostly these were 1-2 meters underwater where the light was not great, and also the water a bit murky because of a constant swell stirruing up the bottom a bit - but not a major disappointment, because not much at all to see ...





## - looking back in












- regardless of the lack of coral, it's a pretty nice place, and my room (circled) a very nice room and location ... it was a nice hour in the water, where I love to be ...

- today we are going to Patok Beach (yellow circle indicates my approximate snorkel route)








made my way over to the northeast corner after a few minutes of wandering around and got into the water ....



first fish, a kind I have not seen much of, but still feeding around rocks, not coral ...










- on the south-central area of the bay, a nice large field of some kind of lettuce coral












the tour master told us not to bother the people at the expensive resort covering most of the beach, so I headed to this little resort on the north shore where the people were friendlier for a Tiger ...

Day 3 - motorcycke tour and snorkel at Ya Nui




- the only helmet they had that would fit me - the plan was a drive around checking out snorkelling possibilities in the morning, and then going there in the afternoon ...

- head out on the highway ...






- as it turns out - not too much different from where I have been, nothing like a reef, a few bits of coral growing on rock, a few fish swimming around ...


















- and so back around to the north side ...








